School Supplies

Backpacks are created on two factors—gender and grade level.

Four grade levels are created to ensure that the right supplies are provided for the right age group.

Backpacks are stuffed with pencils, crayons, notebooks, scissors, binders, glue sticks and other supplies needed to help kids in primary school up to high school.

How Can I get a Backpack?

Families are directed to call 211 to register for a backpack. Information about the Program is provided through the media, word of mouth, local service agencies and notices are provided annually to all Bruce and Grey Ontario Works (OW) and Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) recipients in June and July.
