Featured Research

<u>Discrimination and Other Challenges Experienced by Racialized Newcomers When</u>
<u>Accessing Settlement Services in Southwestern Ontario</u>

Sponsored by: Network for Economic and Social Trends (NEST) & Pathways to Prosperity

This report highlights key barriers that racialized newcomers face when accessing settlement services in Southwestern Ontario. While these services support integration, many newcomers struggle due to:

- Lack of awareness about available services
- Discrimination and systemic bias, especially in smaller communities
- Underrepresentation of services for disabled and 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals

Surveys conducted with newcomers show over 60% of racialized newcomers in five regions experienced discrimination in the past three years. However, immigration retention programs show promise in fostering more welcoming environments through community engagement, tailored services, employer support plans and collaborative partnerships.

The study calls for action to ensure equitable, inclusive services across all communities, citing strategies to improve service equity. Newcomers surveyed offer strategies focusing on:

- Inclusive communication
- Better access and awareness
- Stronger support networks
- · Education, funding, and accountability
